Mar 2. Love as an Intention. We're happy to welcome back Laura Kushner, who will talk about how we can find love for ourselves and those around us in these polarizing times. Our 1st principle, the inherent worth and dignity of every person, reminds us to apply this mindset for self-healing and tolerance while living in a society in which political and social issues are so extremely different. Led by Laura Kushner.

Mar 9. Overlooked: Women in History. Countless contributions to society have been made by women, but historians and scholars have often overlooked them due to gender. We will highlight the accomplishments of five remarkable women and how their contributions changed history. Led by Jeff Wallis and members of the congregation. (Don't forget to set your clocks ahead one hour before bed on March 8.)

Mar 16. Inner Empire. From ancient history to modern times, not everyone living under an imperial regime has surrendered to its demands. Amid concerns about the current rise of religious and political powers, we turn to sources that remind us of where we can find the strength to stand our ground on behalf of ourselves or others, and when in our lives we've done that. Led by Rev. Mary Tiebout.

Mar 23. Slavery and Segregation in New Jersey. Before New Jersey abolished slavery in 1804, thousands of Africans were enslaved here. After abolition, New Jersey served as an important route on the Underground Railroad, helping escaped slaves flee from Maryland and Delaware to points north. Even after the Civil War ended, African Americans continued to face challenges in New Jersey, including segregation of schools and housing. Led by Jim Kasprzak.

Mar 30. Gender Diversity. Margaret Mead's *Coming of Age in Samoa* set off an anthropological search for the diverse possibilities of human response to puberty, the creative ways people sort gendered roles, and the variable ways cultures engage in sexual selection. This presentation provides examples from the Sambia of Papua New Guinea, the Ache of Bolivia, various Two-Spirit folks from some Native Americans, and the Hijras of India. Led by Prof. Anthony Balzano.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:



The Outrageous Abandonment of Ukraine

In 1938, Great Britain and France agreed to allow Nazi Germany to invade and take over parts of Czechoslovakia. The Munich Conference agreement was purely intended to appease Hitler.

We all know how that turned out. World War II started one year later, when Hitler invaded Poland. By the war's end, between 50 and 80 million people had been killed.

Fast forward to February, 2025. Russia was in its third year of fighting to take over Ukraine, having invaded that nation for no reason beyond the Russian president's desire to enlarge his empire. And it appeared that the United States was ready to try appearement again.

The US agreed to meet with the Russians to discuss how to end the war. The Ukrainians weren't invited. Our Secretary of Defense declared it is "unrealistic" to think that Ukraine might get back the 20% of its territory Russia had captured. The US also agreed, in advance, that Ukraine would not be permitted to join the NATO military alliance.

Adding extortion to the process, the US held out the possibility of some sort of support for Ukraine if, and only if, they gave us 50% of its mineral assets.

European leaders, aghast at the US retreat, began talking about the formation of a unified European army. The potential for World War III was ramping up fast.

Could it be a coincidence that our administration has also been talking about taking over Canada, Greenland, and the Panama Canal? Might we be seeing Putin's pending success in expansion, with an eye toward copying it?

Politics might not seem like a proper subject for comment by a religious group like ours. But that changes when millions of lives are at stake due to injustice and betrayal. Is it right for religion to turn a blind eye?

The national UU organization is participating in at least one lawsuit against the administration involving migration arrests. I'm hoping our national leaders will also speak out against the very dangerous appearament of Russia.
